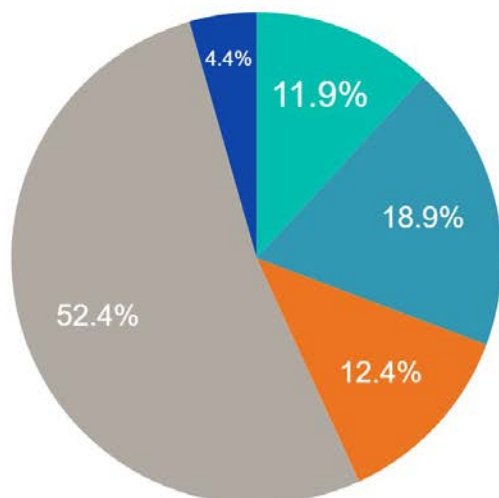

The Diane and Bruce Halle Foundation Transforms the Delivery of Maternal Child Health Care in the East Valley

The Dignity Health Foundation East Valley recently received a generous gift from the Diane & Bruce Halle Foundation to support the completion of Dignity Health's Women's & Children's Pavilion at Mercy Gilbert Medical Center.

The Pavilion, an extension of the partnership between Dignity Health and Phoenix Children's Hospital, will provide increased access to maternity and pediatric care in the Phoenix metro area. A first of its kind in Arizona, the Pavilion combines the expertise of Mercy Gilbert and Phoenix Children's in one convenient location, and will feature obstetric care for normal and high-risk pregnancies, including a state-of-the-art 60-bed Level III NICU.

As the grand opening of the Pavilion draws nearer, the Halle Foundation's generosity will be put to use in outfitting the facility with equipment and resources that will be crucial to providing the level of advanced maternal and pediatric care that both Dignity Health and Phoenix Children's are committed to providing families across the greater Phoenix area and its surrounding communities.

In May of 2023, Dignity Health foundation and hospital leadership hosted representatives from the Halle Foundation for a private dedication of the Pavilion's Main Lobby, which will be named in honor of The Diane & Bruce Halle Foundation in gratitude for their generous support.

D-Backs Give Back Dental Clinic

The Arizona Diamondbacks Foundation honored Dignity Health East Valley Children's Dental Clinic as a 2022 Ken Kendrick Grand Slam Grant winner.

This generous grant expanded the Dental Clinic at the Heritage Center in downtown Gilbert with an additional private operatory. This has enabled us to extend our free preventive dental care services to additional uninsured and underserved children, a mission that is at the very heart of what we do.

13 years ago the Chandler Children's Dental Clinic began in response to an overwhelming need in the community. With this expansion of the clinic in Gilbert, our specially-certified dental hygienists are now able to reach more children in the East Valley. This location is especially significant, serving primarily low-income, Spanish-speaking, and immigrant communities.

Our goal is to go beyond just providing preventive dental care — our Promotora, a bilingual oral wellness educator, ensures that children and their parents learn to care for their dental health, follow a nutritious diet and maintain overall wellness, including mental health.

As we look to the future, we aim to make an even bigger impact. With the Grand Slam funds, we have installed additional dental chairs, enabling us to add an additional day of service per week and provide nearly 1,150 children with two dental appointments each year. We believe every child deserves a healthy smile. Thank you to our friends at the Arizona Diamondbacks Foundation, and many other supporters, for helping us bring more smiles to Gilbert's children.

Care Cruiser Promotes Resiliency

Thanks to generous support from the **Arizona Diamondbacks Foundation**, health care workers at Dignity Health East Valley have a traveling trailer that offers respite during their shifts, allowing them to meditate and rejuvenate while resting in massage chairs, lounging in zero-gravity recliners and easing their muscles using handheld percussion massagers.

This simple yet powerful activity has shown impressive results: better job performance, improved patient outcomes, fewer errors, and increased employee retention.

Resilience spaces such as the **Care Cruiser**, offer a much-needed reprieve during busy workdays, helping health care workers to quiet their minds and rejuvenate their bodies before returning to their patients.

This space was one of many the Arizona Diamondbacks created here in the Valley.

Bowen’s Buddies Endowment Provides Comfort, Healing and Resources to Grieving Families

Jennifer and Brian Butson experienced the unimaginable loss of their child in 2013, a tragedy that no parent should ever face. However, amidst their sorrow, they found a beacon of hope and inspiration, leading them to create a peer-led support group, Heaven’s Hummingbirds, and established an endowment in memory of their son Bowen.

Heaven’s Hummingbirds provides much-needed solace, healing, and resources to grieving parents, bridging the journey from the hospital to home. This incredible group has found meaningful ways to honor our littlest angels, offering a sense of community where grief-stricken families find connection, hope, and understanding.

The “Bowen’s Buddies” endowment fund has been instrumental in supporting infant bereavement programs and services within our hospitals. It has been sustained through the generosity of family, friends, supporters like you, and the annual Spring Family Remembrance Run.

The 2023 run raised a record amount with more than 500 people gathering at a Chandler park to honor the lives of the babies who are gone, yet never forgotten.

Empowering Youth Through Sports Medicine

Dignity Health East Valley has been at the forefront of providing exceptional sports medicine care to the youth of Chandler, Gilbert, Queen Creek, and Maricopa since 2014. We proudly serve over 22,000 students across 23 junior and high schools, offering them collegiate-level athletic training and sports injury management.

Our community-based program is not just about treating injuries; it’s about education and prevention. We train and educate student athletes about vital elements such as nutrition, heat-related issues, and concussion awareness. At the center of our operation are our Masters-level Athletic Trainers (ATs) providing point-of-care services to young athletes. Employee Generosity Transforms Lives after Stroke

We believe the power of healing extends beyond the hospital walls. Our passionate employees are deeply committed to ensuring our post-stroke support programs continue to thrive, helping stroke survivors and their caregivers navigate life after stroke with hope and resilience.

Last year, thanks to the generous donations and volunteer efforts by our employees, they raised funds to ensure life-altering programs are available for survivors and their families. These contributions enabled us to offer stroke support resources free of charge, including our annual three-day Stroke Camp, support groups for both survivors and caregivers, and our therapeutic Music Choir “Ringers of Hope”. Witnessing the progress and improved results of survivors at these programs has been an incredible, rewarding experience.

Research has shown that post-stroke support networks have a profound impact on survivors, resulting in improved speech and movement, stronger relationships, and decreased risk of depression. Furthermore, the burden on caregivers is lessened, providing them with the much-needed support and resources to handle their roles effectively. That's why these programs aren't just important - they are vital.

We want to extend our heartfelt gratitude to our employees and volunteers whose contributions are making a significant difference in the lives of stroke survivors and their families and providing the hope they need to thrive.

Rhonda Curtis's humble service as a volunteer and **collaborative** board member for over 20 years earns her this honor. Rhonda has seen the direct results of her work supporting the poor, enabling the purchase of life-saving equipment, adding rooms to the hospital and assisting in the creation of a new medical center in the Town of Gilbert. With her leadership of the Laughter is the Best Medicine gala, the committee raised almost \$400,000 for Cardiology Services.

Rhonda's years of service have resulted in raising over \$10 million, with a personal giving tallying over \$20,000, plus over 2,000 hours of volunteer service to Dignity Health. She was also the recipient of the Volunteer of the Year award and prize during her tenure at Wells Fargo, which she donated to us. Also adding to Rhonda's total impact are the people in her sphere - family members, friends, clients and colleagues all whom have touched numerous patients' lives by improving their healthcare..

John Nissen is a champion for philanthropy and certainly is very deserving of the title **Board Member of the Year**. John and his wife believe life is fullest when you fulfill the needs of others and serving on this board has given him that opportunity. 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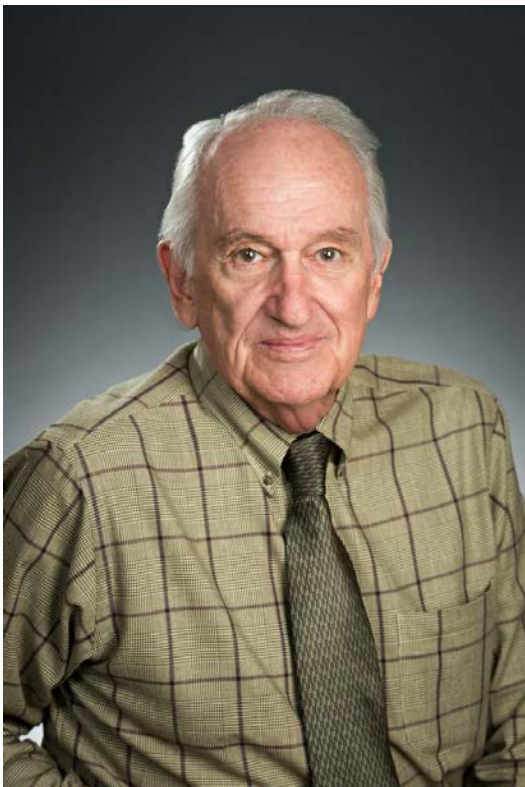
