
















Humankindness in action

Chandler couple thank their Guardian Angels for outstanding care during medical emergency

When they needed fast, expert, compassionate care the most, the staff at Chandler Regional Medical Center stepped up in a big way, say Amber and Mark Webster of Chandler. Several months later, they felt the need to extend heartfelt thanks to their Guardian Angels at Chandler Regional Medical Center for their outstanding care in March 2023. Amber experienced sudden, severe blood clots, requiring a 17-day hospital stay, 10 of which were in a medically induced coma on life support.

Throughout this challenging time, the Websters felt immense support and

kindness from the staff.
Nurses went above and
beyond, from checking on
Mark to braiding Amber's
hair, offering small moments
of dignity and respect that
made a significant
difference.

Grateful for the care they received, the Websters began visiting the hospital cafeteria for date nights, hoping to see and thank their caregivers in person.

Through Amber's employer, The Husband and Wife Law Team, they discovered the Dignity Health East Valley Guardian Angel program,

The Websters credit Amber's survival to the ECMO therapy available at Chandler Regional, funded by donations to the Dignity Health Foundation East Valley. Amber, now fully

recovered, and Mark celebrated her health anniversary at the hospital cafeteria, praising the exceptional care they received.

Amber is one of 23 lives saved since the ECMO program started in March 2022. It's clear that the success of this program and the positive outcomes of our patients is due to the dedication and hard work of the phenomenal ECMO team.

"Not all hospitals are the same," Mark said. "We are lucky to have this one in our neighborhood. I tell everyone who will listen – you will not find better care anywhere else."


Virginia G. Piper Charitable Trust Leads in Advancing Healthcare

Throughout the last six years, our community rose together to advance high-quality health care in the East Valley through the Dignity Rising campaign. Through this record-setting campaign, more than \$25,000,000 was raised to meet the health care needs of our growing community, and especially our most vulnerable neighbors. Both Chandler Regional and Mercy Gilbert Medical Centers are expanding as a result of the generosity of thousands of donors from many walks of life who pledged their support.

One of the most generous and impactful gifts received over the past few years was a \$1,000,000 campaign capstone grant from Virginia G. Piper Charitable Trust..

This gift pushed the campaign to its revenue goal, which we celebrated as a community in October of 2023 at the Dignity Rising campaign celebration. In honor of, and in gratitude for, this transformational gift, the OB Triage Unit inside the new Women's & Children's Pavilion at Mercy Gilbert Medical Center was named in honor of Virginia G. Piper Charitable Trust.

Due to the continued generosity of the Trust towards high-quality health care, when Mercy Gilbert's Women's and Children's Pavilion opens early next year, our community's mothers, babies and families will receive more comprehensive care from pregnancy, to birth, to ongoing pediatric and very unique specialty care for years to come.

Due to the continued growth of the Southeast Valley and the demographics of the community, Dignity Health East Valley is committed to delivering the highest quality of service to young families. This means developing and advancing our Maternal Child Health service line to ensure the best care, service and technology is available to expectant mothers, babies and children of all ages.

This commitment is evidenced in the construction of Dignity Health's new Women's & Children's Pavilion at Mercy Gilbert Medical Center in partnership with Phoenix Children's Hospital. Our partners at the Kemper & Ethel Marley Foundation share in this commitment to families. Dignity Health was grateful to receive a transformational gift from the Marley Foundation, designated to assisting in the completion of the Pavilion's construction and for critical equipment needed to provide services to women and children within the facility.

The Marley Foundation's gift will expand the breadth and depth of Dignity Health's women's and children's programs and services across the entire State, making them more accessible to all who need it, regardless of their circumstances and resources.

AZSTA Provides Hydration Systems to Student Athletes

Dignity Health East Valley has been at the forefront of providing exceptional sports medicine care to the youth of Chandler, Gilbert, Queen Creek, and Maricopa since 2014. We proudly serve over 24,000 students across 41 junior high and high schools, in seven school districts offering collegiate-level athletic training and sports injury management.

Our community-based program is not just about treating injuries; it's about education and injury prevention. We train and educate student athletes about vital elements such as nutrition, heat-related issues, and concussion awareness.

The Sports Medicine program is dependent upon the support of many community partners, including a recent grant received from Arizona Sports & Tourism Authority (AZSTA). With this support, we are now equipped with new commercial-grade hydration and cooling equipment from Frio Hydration which allows for more effective hydration and injury treatment - especially during times when student athletes are most at-risk of suffering heat-related injury.
