The Biggest Smile Ever - Children's Dental Clinic Receives Grant



Improving access to health care for the medically underserved is an integral part of the Dignity Health Mission. Oral health was revealed as an unmet need in the Phoenix East Valley community when a screening program identified a majority of children experiencing tooth decay. In response to this need the Chandler Children's Dental Clinic opened on the campus of Galveston Elementary School in the Chandler Unified School District. This Clinic is currently the only location in the East Valley where children can receive comprehensive preventive clinical services at no cost - although thanks to generous supporters, expansion plans are underway.

Delta Dental Foundation awarded the Dignity Health Foundation East Valley a \$12,000 grant award for 2016 to support the Dignity Health Community Oral Health Programs and the Dental Clinic. The grant monies will be used to continue to provide preventive appointments and oral health education for children and adults in the East Valley community, as well as screening and fluoride varnish applications for children ages 6 through 18. Thank you to Delta Dental Foundation. Thank you as well to the Women's Philanthropic Society - Power of the Purse who also chose this worthwhile program as a recipient of their donations in 2015.

Piper Charitable Trust towards the building of the new tower at Chandler Regional; obtaining the largest grant of over \$2 million from First Things First, and significant annual grants from the City of Chandler.
