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The Gila River Indian Community Supports Dental Health for the Underserved



Do you know which chronic disease is the most prevalent among children? Underserved children are particularly vulnerable to the detrimental effects of this condition, as it endangers their overall health and wellbeing. You might be surprised to learn that it is tooth decay. Left untreated, tooth decay can lead to increased risk for pain and infections that can lead to long term complications by impacting a child's speech, sleep, nutrition and ability to succeed in school. Dignity Health's oral health outreach efforts were recently given a boost through a generous donation to our Children's Dental Clinic by the Gila River Indian Community. Funding was requested and granted in the amount of \$49,655 to the Children's Dental Clinic located in the Chandler CARE Center in the Chandler Redevelopment Area. The Chandler Children's Dental Clinic is a collaborative effort between Dignity Health, Chandler Unified School District and St. Vincent de Paul Clinic. The school district provides space and equipment for Dignity Health to provide preventive dental services and St. Vincent de Paul to provide restorative services. The Chandler clinic is staffed with a registrar, coordinator, educator and dental hygienists. Each has a unique role that contributes to the success of a public health dental clinic. The bilingual registrar develops relationships with families which encourages scheduling of appointments and decreases no shows. The educator's role is to provide oral health education to children and parents. So while regular dental visits/cleanings are important, at home oral hygiene is also vital. Finally, the dental hygienists and coordinator work together to provide exams, cleanings, sealants, fluoride varnish and x-rays. Thanks to the generosity of the Gila River Indian Community, the Chandler Children's Dental Clinic will provide access to a greater number of children who face economic, logistical and cultural barriers to oral care. There are also plans in place for a second clinic at the Gilbert Wellness and Resource Center in Gilbert, AZ. The Center is scheduled to begin services in early 2018 pending additional grant and foundation funding so be sure to spread the word and visit www.suppordignityhealtheastvalley.org
